

CHARLES PALMER CONNER

Passed away peacefully in Santa Ana, California at age 76. Chuck, as his friends and colleagues knew him, was born in Pasadena on February 27, 1928. After serving in the United States Air Force, Chuck began his successful career in the escrow industry. Most notably, he became President of Western Mutual Escrow Corporation, which at one time had 60 branch offices throughout Southern California. In the 1980s and '90s Chuck applied his industry expertise to conducting educational seminars and providing expert witness services. He was an active member and Past-President of the American Escrow Association, as well as the California and Orange County Escrow Associations, which are creating educational awards in his honor. His colleagues remark that "Escrow just won't be the same without Chuck."

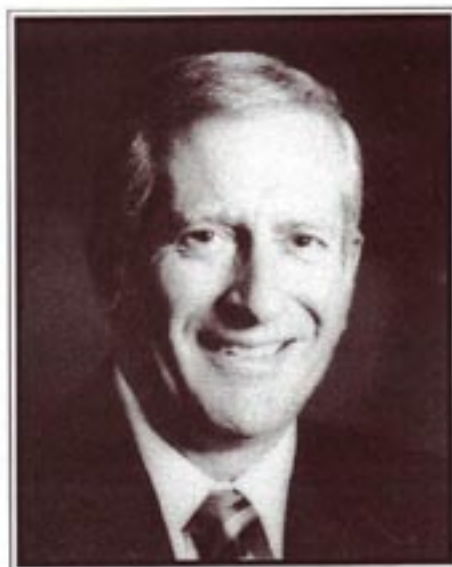
